Activity: Feedback of Students' Taken for Academic Visit to Kailash Cancer Hospital and Research Centre, Muni Seva Ashram, Goraj, Vadodara.
Objective/s: To evaluate the effectiveness of the academic visit in enhancing students' understanding of radiotherapy treatment planning, medical imaging techniques, and nuclear medicine in alignment with their curriculum. It aims to assess students' overall experience, the clarity of explanations provided by hospital staff, and the most valuable aspects of the visit for their academic and professional growth. Additionally, the analysis seeks to identify areas for improvement, such as incorporating more interactive sessions and hands-on learning opportunities, to enhance future visits.
<p>Brief report summary on the Activity :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The academic visit provided students with practical exposure to radiotherapy treatment planning, medical imaging techniques, and nuclear medicine, allowing them to observe advanced clinical practices firsthand. Feedback indicated a high level of satisfaction, with students appreciating expert interactions, hands-on learning, and exposure to new technologies. Suggestions for improvement included more interactive sessions and follow-up resources to further enhance the learning experience. <p>The Feedback Form contained several questions with responses from a group of 18 students. The feedback evaluates different aspects such as overall experience, organization, effectiveness of explanations, practical insights, and suggestions for improvement. It also assessed the hospital staff's clarity in explaining technologies, overall satisfaction, and recommendations for future visits. The responses were recorded on a scale of Excellent, Good, Average, Poor, and Very Poor, where Excellent indicates strong agreement, and Very Poor represents dissatisfaction.</p> <p>1. Overall Experience & Organization: Most participants rated their overall experience as "Excellent" or "Good," indicating a high level of satisfaction. The organization of the visit was also well-received, with only a few participants suggesting minor improvements.</p> <p>2. Practical Insights & Learning: The majority of students confirmed that the visit provided valuable practical insights into radiotherapy, medical imaging, and nuclear medicine. Students appreciated the opportunity to observe real-world applications of their studies.</p> <p>3. Effectiveness of Explanations by Hospital Staff: The hospital staff's explanation of medical technologies was mostly rated "Very Effectively" or "Effectively." A few responses were neutral, suggesting slight room for improvement in clarity or engagement.</p> <p>4. Most Valuable Aspects of the Visit: Students found the following aspects most beneficial for their academic and professional growth:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Direct interaction with experts in the field Hands-on exposure to imaging and radiotherapy technologies Understanding the practical applications of theoretical concepts <p>5. Suggestions for Improvement:</p>

While most students were satisfied with the visit, some suggested:

- More interactive sessions and hands-on activities
- Follow-up resources for deeper learning
- Additional networking opportunities with professionals

The majority of students rated the visit as "Excellent" or "Good," reflecting a positive reception. Some students suggested enhancing interactive elements to further enrich the learning experience.

7. Key Suggestions & Feedback:

Several students appreciated the informative and well-organized nature of the visit. Some suggested including more hands-on activities or providing post-visit resources. A few also mentioned the importance of continued exposure to advanced technologies.
